1. Humanitarian and Operational Updates

- The Chair presented the latest information regarding the displacements recorded to date. As of 8 January 2017, the total number of displaced as a consequence of the Mosul operation reached 135,528. Over 98% are hosted/displaced within Ninewa governorate, especially Al Hamdaniya district (85,302 IDPs) and Mosul district (43,584 IDPs). In Salah al-Din, some 128,500 people in total displaced since June from Baiji and Al Shirqat districts, mostly towards Tikrit. - As of 4 January, Hasansham U3, Hasansham M2, Qaymawa, Al-Alam 2, Qayyarah Jad'ah and Qayyarah Airstrip have reached full capacity. Nargizlia 1 has begun to host IDPs. Amalla, Chamakor, Khazer M1 and Surdesh are ready and have plots available.
- Two new sites are under construction in Zone 1 (Hasansham U2 and Bartella); two in Zone 2 (Nargizla 2 and (new) Zelikan) and five in Zone 4 (Basateen, Hajj Ali, As Salamyiah, Hamam Al-Alil and Al Sh'hamah).
- The Logistics Cluster is formalising agreements with two NGO to set up three Mobile Storage Units (MSUs) in Zummar and three in Khazer/Hasansham, which will provide an extra 1,600 m² of common storage for the humanitarian community.

2. Roundtable discussion on response and logistics constraints/bottlenecks

Access

- Organisations facing issues at the last Peshmerga checkpoint in Makmour are asked to contact the Civ-Mil Coord/Access team for support: iraqaccess@un.org; +964 (0)7827806089.
- OCHA Civ-Mil Coord/Access is working on a more sustainable access approach crossing from the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KRI) to Federal Iraq. Organisations facing issues should contact OCHA Civ-Mil team for support.
- According to OCHA Civ-Mil Coord/Access, issues have also been reported with accessing Hamam al 'Alil and Shura.

Storage

- The Logistics Cluster requested organisations to advise on storage gaps they are facing country-wide; no specific areas of concern were raised.
- The issue of storage in the close vicinity of Mosul city was raised. All participants agreed that Gugjali (east Mosul) would be a key location for storage for the response. The Logistics Cluster will be participating in an inter-agency mission to Gugjali on 10 January to assess the storage options available. Mercy Hands will advise on the storage options found on their recent assessment in Gugjali.
- Hammam al 'Alil has also been proposed by the Logistics Cluster as a potential logistics hub for the prepositioning of items to serve west Mosul city. Participants expressed interest in this location; the Logistics Cluster will conduct a site assessment on 13 January.

3. Common Services

- Eight flights, carrying 256 mt of EU in-kind contributions, have so far arrived in Erbil. One more is due over the next week. Organisations receiving allocations will submit a Release Order Form to the Logistics Cluster as per the usual SOPs.
- The Logistics Cluster has shared a snapshot outlining the application process for the One Stop Shop (OSS) for customs clearance for cargo incoming to the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KRI). The snapshot is available on the Logistics Cluster website at the following link:

- The Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) process for 2017 is ongoing. The overall objective for the Logistics Cluster is *to help expand the operational reach and presence of humanitarian partners*. The Cluster will hold a peer review session in January in order to get feedback from partners. Organisations willing to take part in this session should contact the Logistics Cluster.

- As of today, the Logistics Cluster storage capacity at each hub is as follows:
 - Baghdad: 2,000 m²
 - Bardarash: 1,200 m²
 - Dahuk/Batel: 2,773 m²
 - Debaga: 320 m² planned
 - Erbil: 6,300 m²
 - Hajj Ali: 640 m²
 - Jad'ah camp: 320 m²
 - Khazer/Hasanshan: 320 m² (*additional 800 m² planned*)
 - Owainat: 640 m²
 - Qayyarah Airstrip camp: 1,280 m²
 - Tikrit: 2,400 m²
 - Zummar: 800 m² planned
- All common storage facilities can be accessed by humanitarian organisations on a free to user basis. A revised ConOps map has been circulated to partners and is available on the Logistics Cluster website at the following link: www.logcluster.org/map/concept-operations-map-18-december-2016.
- Participants were asked to share ideas or areas of interest for potential trainings to be conducted by the Logistics Cluster in 2017. Initial feedback received included basic warehouse management training and transporter contracting basic training.
