1. Humanitarian and Operational Updates

- The Chair presented the latest information regarding the displacements recorded to date. As of 3 December 2016, the total number of displaced as a consequence of the Mosul operation reached 129,642. Over 98% are hosted/displaced within Ninewa governorate, especially Al Hamdaniya district (81,690 IDPs) and Mosul district (40,380 IDPs). - From 30 December, IDPs have started to arrive in Nargizlia 1; organizations are asked to share their expected pipelines and storage needs for the area, in order to anticipate common storage demand.
- The Hajj Ali camp is very near to completion and expected to begin hosting people in the coming week. The Logistics Cluster already has rub halls in place for common storage (capacity of 640 m2).
- The Logistics Cluster is finalizing an agreement with an NGO participant to install three Mobile Storage Units (MSUs) for common storage purposes in Khazer and Debaga camps, providing a further 800 m2 of prepositioning capacity for the humanitarian community.

- Partners have reported that the cost for renting warehouses in Dahuk is high and there is substantial competition among the humanitarian community for the assets. There are also reported additional storage needs in and around the new emergency camps of Nargizlia and Qaymawa.
- There have been many reports in the last week of issues at the Makmour checkpoint. Civ-Mil Coord. is working on solutions for this, and organizations are asked to contact them if experiencing issues.

- A roundtable discussion was held on any bottlenecks/logistics gaps partners are facing. The following issues were raised:
 - Some organizations have been asked to handover their vehicle license in order to pass checkpoints.
 - Peshmerga requirements are not clear, and change depending on the checkpoint/area.
 - Shipments travelling from Baghdad to Erbil have experienced problems getting through checkpoints, on some occasions getting turned back.
 - There is a storage gap for medical items near Hasansham. The Logistics Cluster will reach out to partners to explore possible cost sharing exercises.

2. Logistics Cluster Updates and Common Services

- Six flights, carrying 180 mt of EU in-kind contributions, have so far arrived in Erbil. Three more are due over the next week. Organizations that will receive allocations will submit a Release Order Form to the Logistics Cluster as per the usual SOPs.
- The Logistics Cluster has shared a snapshot outlining the application process for the One Stop Shop (OSS) for customs clearance for cargo incoming to the Kurdistan Region of Iraq (KRI): <http://www.logcluster.org/document/snapshot-customs-clearance-one-stop-shop-december-2016>.
- The Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) process for 2017 is ongoing. The overall objective for the Logistics Cluster is *to help expand the operational reach and presence of humanitarian partners*. The Cluster will hold a peer review session in January in order to get feedback from partners. Organizations willing to take part in this session are asked to contact the Logistics Cluster.

- As of today, the Logistics Cluster storage capacity at each hub is as follows:
 - Baghdad: 2,000 m²
 - Bardarash: 1,200 m²
 - Dahuk/Batel: 2,773 m²

- Debaga: 320 m² planned
 - Erbil: 6,300 m²
 - Hajj Ali: 640 m²
 - Jad'ah camp: 320 m²
 - Khazer/Hasanshan: 320 m² (additional 800 m² planned)
 - Owainat: 640 m²
 - Qayyarah Airstrip camp: 1,280 m²
 - Tikrit: 2,400 m²
 - Zummar: 800 m² planned

3. Brief on Civ-Mil Coord. Access

- Civ-Mil Coord. has been conducting access missions in and around Mosul since the offensive operation began in mid-October. The majority of the population remains in the city with very limited access to food, water, kerosene and medicine.
- In regards to responding in West Mosul, access is severely limited. Strong logistics support will be needed, such as common logistics hubs being set up in strategic locations. Organizations are asked to share their ongoing response and/or prepositioning plans with the Logistics Cluster and the Civ-Mil Coord. team in order to best anticipate and support needs.
